Margdarshak and Sanghamitra

To create an efficient team of volunteers who are well trained and certified to provide support to the women victims who go through various kinds of abuse such as sexual, domestic, stalking etc, in their life and empower them to make informed decisions and regain control of their lives.

Mission

Margdarshak and Sanghamitra are volunteers who are equipped with information and knowledge about various aspects of the law, redressal mechanism, process and procedures for seeking professional help and extend a helping hand in reporting the matter to the concerned authorities and also guide the person in distress to take an informed decision. Facilitate consultations with Police-Legal services, counseling services and support systems. Provide them an avenue for navigating through the law enforcement system and offer emotional support by creating a nurturing environment.

Margdarshak and Sanghamitra will act as a bridge between the victim and the Police as well as the various associated resources such as helpline centers, shelter homes, counselors, and others. They are provided with basic awareness of related laws and have regular interaction with law-enforcing authorities to help the distressed person in resolving the issue.

Margdarshaks are resources within every member company at Rachakonda.

Sanghamitra is the first structured outreach effort to connect with residential communities in Rachakonda.


Don't Suffer in Silence, Reach Out to us :






Physical Fitness - Emotional Wellbeing

be a brand ambassadors both formally and also in the social platform for a bigger positive impact. Dr Vijaya Bhavani a social development professional with PhD in





The program concluded with a promise to do many impactful and effective programs in the near future followed by vote of thanks and National Anthem.





Traffic Marshals Activities Report – April 2021 to March 2022

The Mission:

Traffic Marshals of Rachakonda Security Council (RKSC), a select group of civil society volunteers, trained by the Rachakonda Police. The purpose of volunteering is to invest time and energy into assisting the existing work force of Rachakonda Traffic Police that will produce value and contribute to the society. Engaging in a volunteering project like Traffic

Marshals must be done with extreme care and attention to have a positive result.

Started in February 2021, the Traffic Marshals division of RKSC have been in the forefront of assisting the Rachakonda Police in not just regular traffic monitoring and streamlining, but also contributed in a big way during the Covid 19 pandemic, ensuring the communication of the Govt is spread to the common people

A Summary of the activities done during the year 2021 - 2022

April 2021

Lockdown 2nd wave of the Covid19 pandemic

In view of the Night Curfew put in place by the Government, the RKSC volunteers sensitised the public on the same and requested the shops, hawkers, vegetable vendors to close their establishments early and ensure they reach their homes before 9.00 PM. Four teams were deployed by the RKSC Traffic Forum Chief Coordinator Lion Dr Raghuveer Acharya to take the message of the Covid19 prevention measures to the public in the Rachakonda police limits.

Highlighting the need for adhering to Covid19 safety protocols, the volunteers educated the people on the need to always wear masks, sanitisation of hands regularly and maintaining social distance in public places. The traffic Marshals also distributed masks to the public in all the places.



The RKSC volunteers over the weekend of April 23, 24 & 25th organized many more such camps across the Rachakonda police limits to educate and enable public participation in maintaining strict prevention measures in view of the rampant spread of the pandemic.



Teams were deployed at Radhika X Roads, ECIL X Roads, Neredmet X Roads, Sainikpuri, Safilguda, Anand Bagh and Gautam Nagar weekly markets, where people were sensitised about the importance of fighting the pandemic collectively through wear-ing masks, social distancing and regular sanitising and washing of hands. Over 1000 masks sponsored by Lions Club of Alwal Sahara were distributed by the Marshals during the period.





May 2021

Lockdown Enforcement and Covid19 protocols awareness

The RKSC volunteers assisted the Rachakonda Police throughout the month of May 2021, in spite of the peaking of the 2nd wave of the pandemic by monitoring key checkpoints, X roads and ensuring adherence to Covid19 safety protocols.





June 2021

ACTIVITIES

The Commissioner of Police Rachakonda Shri Mahesh M Bhagwat IPS has contemplated the initiative of adopting Zilla Parishad High School (ZPHS). Thereafter, General Secretary RKSC Shri.Vadlamani Satish and Joint Secretary RKSC Shri. P. Sudhakar carried out a survey and had an audience with the Sarvail Gram Sarpanch, Shri. Bhikshapati. The core findings of the survey include deplorable conditions of the primary school, lack of toilets and proper sanitation facilities. Engineers were sent by Divi's Laboratories Ltd. to inspect the area of the school and a cost estimation was made by the civil contractors.

Spearheaded by Sri Mahesh Bhagwat IPS, Commissioner of Police, Rachakonda the infrastructure of old school was restructured, compound wall, pavement and gates were built, connectivity to lights, fans and pipelines was given. In addition, the initiative also fixed the overhead tanks, dug borewell and installed submersible motor, arranged lunch sit out area, connectivity to drinking water was given in ground floor. While, the construction of High School and Primary School toilets is currently underway.

ANGANWADI SCHOOL

Sri Mahesh Bhagwat IPS, Commissioner of Police, Rachakonda is instrumental for the initiative to empower rural women through micro-entrepreneurship. Under his guidance the Anganwadi school, Sarvail, Narayanpur was renovated for women tailoring classes. In these classes women are taught how to sew clothes thereby connecting them to large-scale market opportunities, increasing both their earning potential and self-confidence.



WAY FORWARD

Education is what builds a nation generation after generation and the process begins early on first at homes/communities and then in the schools. Further, Zilla Parishad High Schools need to be adopted to strengthen Government schools that are providing formal education in rural areas in India. The children attending these schools pay little or no fees and come from low socioeconomic backgrounds. The goal of this program is to increase the student enrolment & incorporate good teaching and learning techniques in government schools and ensure that the education that the children receive is effective.

CYBER FORUM INITIATIVE

CYBER YODDHA



An initiative was taken up by Rachakonda Commissionerate in collaboration with the Rachakonda Security Council and the ENDNOW foundation under the leadership and guidance of Shri Mahesh M Bhagwat for creating awareness of cybercrime and digital wellness among the youth, software professionals, and students in Telangana. The program was launched, keeping in view the rising number of cybercrimes in the Commissionerate limits. A total of 704 cybercrime cases were reported in 2020, up from 334 in 2019. On the occasion, Telangana's Information Technology (IT) Principal Secretary Shri Jayesh Ranjan (IAS) unveiled a new program Cyber Charcha. Cyber Charcha, is a concept based on crowdsourcing and is a very effective way to align learning with the speed of business. 

